EARTH CHANGE REQUIREMENTS
(Reference R323.1709)

1. All earth changes shall be designated constructed and completed in such a manner which shall limit the exposed of any disturbed land for the shortest possible period of time.
2. Sediment by accelerated soil erosion shall be removed from runoff before it leaves the site of the earth change.
3. Any temporary or permanent facility designed and constructed for the convenience of water around, through or from the earth change area shall be designed to limit the water flow to a non-erosive velocity.
4. Temporary soil erosion control facilities shall be removed and earth change areas graded and stabilized with permanent soil erosion control measures pursuant to approved standards and specifications.
5. Permanent soil erosion control measures for all slopes, channels, ditches and any disturbed land area shall be completed within five (5) calendar days after final grading of the final earth change or the final earth change has been completed. All temporary soil erosion control measures shall be maintained until permanent soil erosion control measures are implemented.
